ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION AND
REINSTATING PHARMACY LICENSE

By Order dated March 21, 1984 (th "1984 Order"), the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") found Lawrence M. Schultz, P.D. (the "Respondent") guilty of violating §12-311(b) (21) of the Health Occupations Article. The Board suspended the Respondent's license to practice pharmacy for four (4) months. At the end of four (4) months the suspension was stayed and respondent was placed on probation subject to certain conditions (the "Conditions of Probation").

By letter dated August 20, 1985, Respondent petitioned the Board for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in Maryland without any condition or restriction. At its meeting on September 18, 1985, the Board reviewed Respondent's petition for reinstatement. Based on its review of that petition and the reports submitted to the Board by the persons, monitoring respondent's progress pursuant to the Conditions of Probation, the Board determined that respondent had satisfactorily fulfilled all of the Conditions of Probation contained in the 1984 Order.

FINDING OF FACT

The Board finds that Respondent has satisfactorily complied with all the Conditions of Probation imposed by its 1984 Order.


CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Board concludes as a matter of law that it is appropriate to terminate Respondent's Conditions of Probation and to reinstate his pharmacy license without any condition or restriction.

UPON THE FOREGOING Finding of Fact and Conclusion of Law, it is this 16 day of October, 1985, by a unanimous vote of a quorum of the Board

ORDERED that effective as of the date of this Order, the Conditions of Probation imposed on Respondent's practice of pharmacy by the Board's 1984 Order are hereby **TERMINATED** and of no force and effect; and be it further

ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State be **REINSTATED** without any condition or restriction whatsoever.
